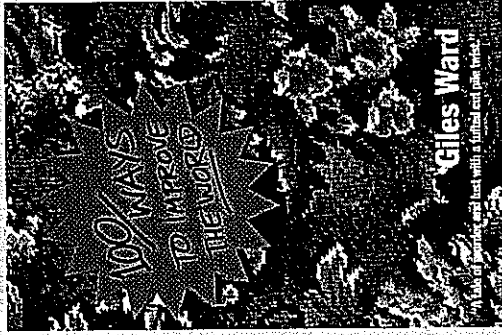


Books that thrill with plots that grip



Peter's tidy new world unravels and it is soon rife with murder, gambling and infidelity

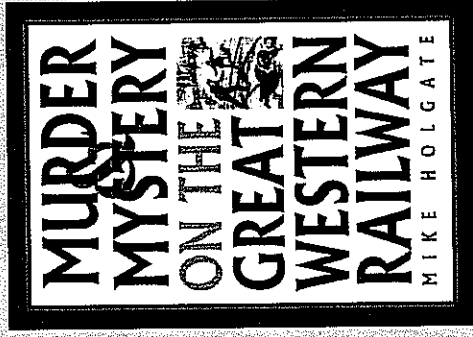
100 Ways to Improve the World
